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ORGANISATION OF STUDIES

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Study module

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The study module is the basic unit of study planning describing a single study subject taught for one semester. A study module may include various combinations of lectures, laboratory work, practice, seminars, the student's independent work, scientific research, design work or other type of work.

Study modules may be mandatory, alternative (selected from a list), general and optional (from the list of modules the University offers). Studies of each module are completed by an evaluation of the students knowledge and skills – an examination or a different form of final assessment.

Find your timetable, assessment results and other relevant information about studies in the Academic Information System (AIS).

Study creditThe scope of studies is measured in study credits that describe a
students workload. The full-time study workload for one year is 60
credits - 1600 work hours.

Assessment system In the University, the cumulative assessment method is used: study results are measured by intermediate assessments, and the final grade is the sum of the results of intermediate assessments and the final assessment (examination). A student who fails to submit individual semester work tasks is not allowed to participate in the final assessment.



- **Tuition fees** In the University, tuition fees are applied for:
 - studying in non-state-funded positions;
 - · retaking separate study programme modules;
 - studying additional modules that are not included in your study programme;
 - retaking the intermediate module assessment or final module assessment a second time;
 - retaking a module in the following semester due to having not passed the final module assessment.

Attendance	It is mandatory to attend laboratory works. The attendance requirements for other types of classes (theory, practice, etc.) are set by each teacher. In the first class of the module, the teacher introduces the minimal attendance requirements, which then are published in the module description in the AIS. Disciplinary penalties are applied to students who do not attend lectures and classes under the determined procedure.
	In exceptional cases, the Facultys Dean can allow a student to attend classes, to perform tasks and to get assessments on an individual schedule.
Teacher consultations	Consult your module teacher in case you need any additional help with the module work.
Academic honesty	The base of the culture of your University is academic values and principles of ethics. Academic honesty is one of the most important academic University values. Remember that no form of cheating in attempt to get a grade for your individual semester tasks and no form of cheating in examinations are tolerated. Dishonest conduct has consequences – you receive an academic penalty, consequently losing the right to retake your assessments. Having breached the Code of Academic Ethics twice and having received academic penalties, the student is expelled from the University.

INTERNATIONALISATION

- **"ERASMUS+**" ERASMUS+ is the most popular student exchange programme in Europe. It offers the opportunity to study and acquire hands–on experience, creates an environment of openness and tolerance and encourages the dialogue of cultures and a global way of thinking. Erasmus scholarships – up to 700 €/month!
- **Erasmus+ studies** KTU has almost 400 partners offering quality programmes and new student experiences. These studies are fully transferable between universities and the results are included in your diploma. The call for applications is announced in the months of September and March.

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Internships You may do an internships in the companies, science research centres and other organisations that are in the countries participating in the Erasmus+ programme. You may do a summer internship in between semesters and (or) an internship after graduation. During your mandatory summer internship, you will acquire professional knowledge, get acquainted with the job market requirements and establish both business and new personal relations.

Bilateral exchange outside of Europe! You may travel abroad for 1–2 semester exchange studies and for summer/winter programmes, as KTU has a number of bilateral cooperation and student exchange agreements with partner universities. For KTU students, study in partner universities is free–of–charge (except for summer schools). The travel and accommodation abroad costs are to be covered by the student with the chance to be awarded a KTU mobility scholarship.

SERVICES

Dormitory accommodation fee adjustment

KTU offers dormitory accommodation where a student can have a shared room (2 or 3 people), may use the kitchen, laundry, internet and other facilities. Monthly rent rates vary depending on the room type ranging from 60 to 140 EUR.

If you prefer to have more space or would like to live in a certain area of Kaunas, you may choose renting a flat. The rental prices vary depending on the number of rooms, location, living conditions, period of rent, etc. Average rent prices are from 200 to 300 EUR per month for a flat (1–3 rooms).

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Health insurance What kind of insurance you need depends on your nationality:

Citizens of EU/EEA Countries

Please acquire an adequate health/travel insurance for studies at KTU. Citizens of EU/EEA countries simply need to obtain the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) from the social security authorities in their home country. Holders of EHIC cards are entitled to the same benefits provided by the Lithuanian Insurance Institution as Lithuanian citizens. Private insurance for acute illnesses and accidents is highly recommended.

Citizens of other countries

Students from non–EU countries may obtain their health insurance either in their country or in Lithuania.

An opportunity to reduce the dormitory accommodation fee is applicable to students in a difficult material or social situation.

Box Breathing exercises recommended by the KTU psychologist will help you rid yourself of the fear of assessments

The steps of box breathing

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Slowly exhale, getting all the oxygen out of your lungs. Focus on this intention and be conscious of what you're doing.

Exhale through your mouth for the same slow count of four as you complete the downward stroke of your box, expelling the air from your lungs and abdomen. Be conscious of the feeling of the air leaving your lungs. Inhale slowly and deeply through your nose to the count of four. Feel the air fill your lungs, one section at a time, until your lungs are completely full and the air moves into your abdomen. Imagine you are drawing the upward stroke of what will become a box.

Hold your breath for four seconds, and imagine you are drawing the first horizontal stroke of your box.

THE SCRIPT FOR SUCCESSFUL **ADAPTATION** AT THE UNIVERSITY

Becoming a student is an important stage in your life, and it has to do with new opportunities, revelations, change and challenges. At the same moment you might feel enthusiastic, happy, excited and maybe even nervous.

Every person is unique and reacts to change differently. That is why sometimes more time and effort is needed to successfully integrate into the University life.

- **1. Ask** It is natural that many things seem unclear, and guestions and doubts can arise. Teachers, administration staff and your older colleagues, the students, are ready to help you find answers to your questions. You may also always consult your peer mentor and the KTU psychologist.
- 2. Share your experiences Many students face some kind of difficulties. A heartfelt conversation on how you are feeling and what you are facing helps you to feel better, look at the situation differently, find new solutions and find support.

3. Communicate with your family, relatives and friends

You might miss home, parents and friends, and the new routine might cause a lot of stress. Becoming a student is a change that can make you lose the things you were used to and, at the same time, gain something new. Find the time to be with your family and friends. It is important to find a balance between keeping in contact with relatives and friends, and between the time you spend on adaptation and integrating into the University life.

4. Step outside your comfort zone	It is reasonable to feel fear and worry, while feeling curious about the new and the unexperienced. Find a balance between the activities that you are accustomed to and those that make you feel awkward. Stepping out of your comfort zone provides you with an ideal chance to understand yourself better, become more confident and find new, interesting activities and opportunities for self-realisation.
5. Plan your time	When you become a student, new opportunities arise and you gain more freedom, yet more responsibility too. It is important to identify your priorities, study systematically and to distribute other activities throughout

the semester, while maintaining a balance between work and relaxation.

This will help you achieve your goals and avoid additional stress.

6. Be active The beginning of studies is perfect for integration into the activities of various University organisations, starting new relationships, having new experiences and realising yourself.

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8. Live a healthy lifestyle Eat healthy, get enough sleep and be physically active. These are aspects to keep in mind not only for maintaining your physical but also mental health.

YOUR FINANCES

The biggest University Talent Scholarships in Lithuania are awarded to the most active students who achieve exceptional results in their studies, research or art projects, who are active in extra–curricular activities in the areas of business, innovations and social activities that promote the KTU name. All bachelor's and master's students, as well as integrated and non–degree studies students can participate in the University Talent Scholarship competition, except for the bachelor students in the first semester of their first year.

The University Talent Scholarship amounts to 250 EUR per month. The total amount of support allocated per semester is 1,000 EUR.


